

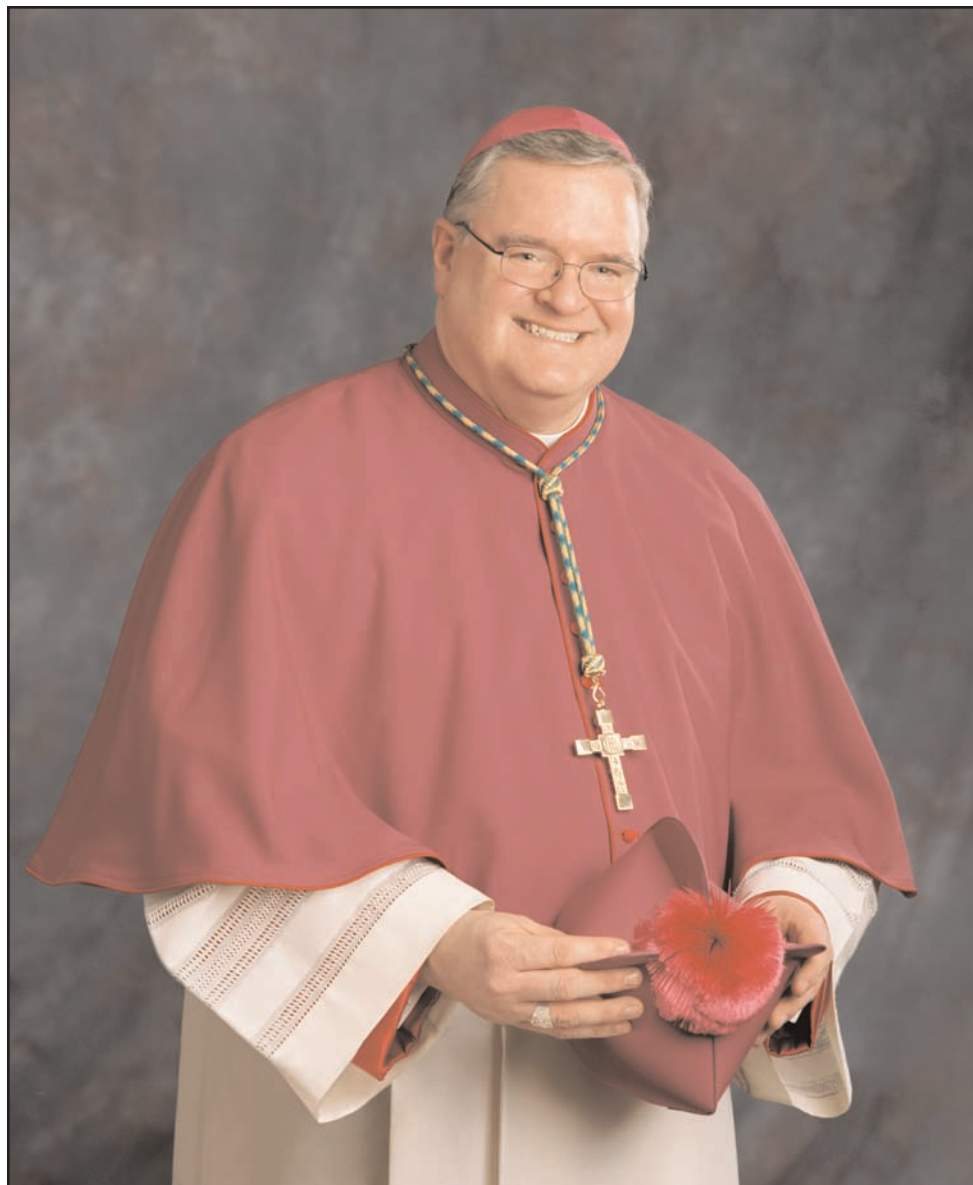

### About the Bishop

#### Coat of Arms

The shield is divided by a chevron, reminiscent of a carpenter's square, paying honor to the Bishop's baptismal patron, Saint Joseph, the foster father of Jesus.

The upper portion contains a rose and a lion.

The Rose honors the Blessed Mother under her title of Mystical rose as well as Saint Therese, the Little Flower. The lion is found in the Wallace family arms (the Bishop's mother's family) and is a symbol of Mark the Evangelist.

In the lower portion is a gold Benedictine cross (the Bishop was trained by Benedictines in college seminary) and two fleur-de-lis, symbolizing Saints Mary and Joseph and are also found in the arms of the Diocese of Joliet, the local Church in which the Bishop Siegel was baptized, ordained and has served as a priest.

The motto: In te domine speravi (from the Te Deum and Psalm 33:22): "In you Lord, I have placed my hope."

The six tassels on each side of the green hat show that he has the rank of bishop. Cardinals have red hats and archbishops have ten tassels.

### *Is It Time For You To Sign Up?*

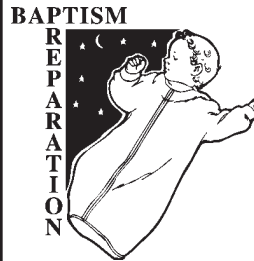
Simply go to [www.visitationparish.org](http://www.visitationparish.org) and click on **E-giving**. You will be linked to the **E-giving** site. The website will walk you through sign-up.

Important things to know when you sign up:

1. You can make changes to your E-giving account at any time and those changes will be effective with your next cycle of contributions.
2. Please indicate your envelope number.
3. When you E-give for special collections, you must select the one-time button at the bottom of the screen. You **CANNOT** combine one-time contributions with regularly scheduled Sunday contributions. Recurring Sunday contributions must be entered separately.
4. Anyone who donates by E-giving still receives collection envelopes to drop in the collection basket during Mass. A small box is printed on the envelope to indicate electronic donations. If you do not wish to receive envelopes you may call the Rectory office to arrange to discontinue them

## Low Gluten Hosts

For Catholics who have celiac disease (a digestive disorder that is triggered by gluten, a protein found in wheat, barley and other grains), the Benedictine Sisters from Clyde, Missouri have developed a low gluten host. These hosts are safe for most people who have celiac disease (they contain .01% gluten) yet satisfy the requirements for sacramental use. Any parishioners who wish to receive communion using these special hosts should contact one of the priests. The parish will provide a pyx. Before Mass, the person puts the special host in the pyx and then places the pyx in one of the ciboria on the gift table to be brought up at the offertory. At Communion time, the celebrant of the Mass will have the pyx in his ciborium and will give it to the person when they come up for communion.

When a priest celebrates Mass, he offers the Eucharistic Sacrifice to the Father, with Christ and in the Holy Spirit, for the living and the dead, for the salvation of all, for the many needs of the people of God. Within this context, it has also been the custom for well over a thousand years for persons to ask that a Mass be offered for a special intention: for an individual person, living or deceased, for some spiritual or temporal need, or to express thanks to God. Typically an offering is made with the request, although this is not required.

When such a special intention is requested, it should be understood that the priest will keep this intention in his mind and heart when he offers the Mass, along with the needs of the whole Church and for the whole human family. A Mass can never be narrowed down to a single intention, and so it can never be said that a person “buys” a Mass or has a monopoly on its intentions. It is always the prayer of the whole Church. It is required by Church law that that one Mass each Sunday and holy day be offered for the intentions of the people of the parish. The intentions for parish Masses are published in the bulletin each week.

The custom at Visitation Parish has been to mention the intention during the Prayers of the Faithful. As this is not the custom at all parishes, a visiting priest may not be familiar with our practice and so may inadvertently forget to mention the intention. Please be assured that the priest always remembers the intention in his heart when he celebrates the Mass and so the graces of the Holy Eucharist are offered for the intention whether the intention is mentioned out loud or not.

If you wish to have a Mass offered for an intention, please contact the Rectory. In the dioceses of Illinois, the customary offering for an intention is ten dollars. Again this is a donation, and is not required for a Mass to be offered.
