Baptisms

Will be every Sunday at 1:00 P.M. Parents are required to take Baptismal Class beforehand. Classes are held every other month, so please plan ahead. Call Rectory for information.

Marriages

Arrangements must be made at the Rectory at least six months in advance. Please contact the church before making any other arrangements. Weddings scheduled at 12:00 & 2:00 P.M. on Saturday. NO Sunday Weddings.

Funerals

It is the responsibility of the parish to bury their dead. The funeral director will contact the parish regarding arrangements. No specific offering is required for the parish in connection with the funeral liturgy.

Perpetual Adoration Chapel

The Perpetual Adoration Chapel of Our Lady, Mother of the Eucharist, is available 24 hours a day for private prayer and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, exposed on the Altar. The Chapel is located in the Convent building (south of the church).

St. Peregrine Novena

Devotions in honor of Saint Peregrine, the patron saint of those who suffer with cancer will be held the third Tuesday of every month at 7:00 P.M. in the church.

Visits to the Sick

CONTINUING PROJECTS

1. **Church**—Work is 90% complete and we are on target to resume weekend Masses in the Church on July 31–August 1.
2. **Kearsage Parking Lot**—The strike is over. Work resumed on Wednesday, July 21.
3. **School**—The Science Room renovations are continuing at a very good pace.

ADORATION CHAPEL PARKING IN SCHOOL LOT

While the remainder of the Kearsage parking lot is repaved and new storm sewers are installed, parking for the Adoration Chapel will be in the school parking lot. A designated area on the west side of the lot has been marked off for chapel parking near the north York Road entrance by the main entrance of the school. Please use the York Road sidewalk to reach the chapel. Also, overnight parking on Adams Street is allowed as well as during the day.

CHURCH CLOSED FOUR WEEKS THIS SUMMER

The Church and Podesta Hall will be closed from June 28 until July 28 for the installation of a water sprinkling system. This system is required by the city because of the addition of the parish center to the church building. Sunday and weekdays Masses as well as confessions will be held in the Valentino Center during this time. Funerals will be celebrated at Ascension of Our Lord Church in Oakbrook Terrace. We are grateful to Fr. Donnelly, the incoming pastor of Ascension Parish, for allowing us to use the church during this time.

Excerpt From a Sermon on The Holy Hour (part one)

By Bishop Fulton J. Sheen

Our Blessed Lord spent ten times as much time in silence as He did in action; thirty years obeying, three years teaching, and three hours redeeming. One of the most salutary of all silent ways is the Holy Hour.

“There was only one request Our Blessed Lord ever made directly to His apostles. In a general way He asked for drink when He was on the Cross, but to His own disciples He said explicitly, ‘Can you not watch one hour with Me?’ Now, why did Our Lord use the word ‘hour?’ He did not ask His disciples to sit up all night on a mountaintop in prayer, He did not ask them to go into the Garden to share His agony, they did not have to suffer a blood sweat. He merely asked, ‘Can you not watch one hour with me?’

“Every time the word ‘hour’ is used in Scripture in the New Testament in connection with Our Lord, it is always in relationship to His Passion and Death, and to the evil forces in the world. When the people attempted to stone Him, Scripture says His hour has not yet come. When they attempted to throw Him over the brow of His own hometown, His hour was not yet come. When the Blessed Mother asked for His first miracle, He asked her if she were sending Him on His hour, ‘My hour is not yet come.’ In other words, ‘that hour when I go My death to face the force of evil.’

“We are living in that hour today, for the devil is loose. Our Hour is related to the evil and the crucifying forces of our modern world. This is why today we should make the Hour as we have never made it before!

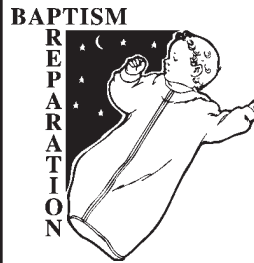
