1. **Church** The first foundation pour for the new parish center began on Friday, August 13, and is ongoing as it will take 5–6 pours to lay.
2. **Kearsage Parking Lot** The lot will be available beginning this weekend (August 15–16) for parking. The Kearsage Street sidewalk will be the only route to the Church.
3. **School** Finishing work is being done this week in the Science Room/Resource Classroom. We anticipate completion by the first week of school.

Parish Pastoral Council Openings

There are three openings for membership on the Parish Pastoral Council. The purpose of the Council is to function as an advisory body to the Pastor. It is an instrument of common counsel for the Pastor and Parish Pastoral Staff in the process of defining Visitation Parish goals, determining parish policies and executing of programs and activities in all matters pertaining to the spiritual and temporal affairs of the parish. Members serve for three-year terms (which may be renewed once). The Council meets on the first Tuesday of each month from September to June, and all members are expected to attend. Any registered and active adult parishioner, 18 years of age or older, who has been a member of the parish for at least two years is eligible to serve. Council members are asked to share their time, energy and talents in representing, supporting and promoting the mission and goals of Visitation Parish.

Those interested in serving as a member are asked to submit a letter to the Council introducing themselves to the Council and explaining the number of years they have been a registered parishioner, their current and past involvement in the parish and what they believe they can contribute to the Council. These letters are due to the Parish Business Office by Friday, August 27, 2010. The Council will vote on these nominations at their September meeting.

Low Gluten Hosts

For Catholics who have celiac disease (a digestive disorder that is triggered by gluten, a protein found in wheat, barley and other grains), the Benedictine Sisters from Clyde, Missouri have developed a low gluten host. These hosts are safe for most people who have celiac disease (they contain .01% gluten) yet satisfy the requirements for sacramental use. These hosts can be obtained by contacting the Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration at 1-800-223-2772, or visiting their Web site: www.benedictinesisters.org.

Any parishioners who wish to receive communion using these special hosts should contact one of the priests. The parish will provide a pyx. Before Mass, the person puts the special host in the pyx and then places the pyx in one of the ciboria on the gift table to be brought up at the offertory. At Communion time, the celebrant of the Mass will have the pyx in his ciborium and will give it to the person when they come up for communion.

Would You Like to Serve as an Usher?

We presently need additional ushers/greeters/ministers of hospitality. Those (women and men of high school age and older) who would like to volunteer, please fill out the Usher Ministry Sign-up Form located in the ushers room in the back of the vestibule near the men's restroom. You do NOT have to commit to be at any specific Mass, but we do require that gentlemen wear dress pants with dress shirt and tie with or without a suitcoat or sportcoat OR a dress shirt and no tie with a suitcoat or sportcoat. We do require that ladies wear a dress or skirt or professional pantsuit. Both ladies and gentlemen are also required to wear an usher pin.

When you arrive at any Mass, you simply identify yourself to the Usher Captain at the rear of the Church before Mass begins. You will be assigned tasks if your help is needed.


